

Requirements for manuscripts submitted to 'NURSING IN THE 21st CENTURY'

DETAILED INFORMATION – SUBMITTING MANUSCRIPTS FOR PUBLICATION

Sending the manuscripts to the Editorial Office

The editorial board of „Nursing of the 21st century” uses an **online platform** to register new articles:

www.editorialsystem.com/piel21/

Submitting a manuscript to the Editorial Board constitutes a declaration that the manuscript has not been previously published in other journals and has not been previously submitted to another Editorial Board. Submitting a manuscript for publication constitutes the consent of all authors to its publication and a declaration that the authors had full access to all data in the study and assume full responsibility for the entirety of the data and the accuracy of its analysis.

The corresponding author (as one of the co-authors) agrees to provide, when submitting the article via the online platform, the names of all co-authors, along with their current email addresses, phone numbers, and affiliation information.

Email addresses should be those of the institution with which the author is affiliated.

A prerequisite for publication is that the authors have read and accepted all copyright statements.

Article Submission Guidelines

- Original, review, and case report articles** are published in a bilingual version (in Polish and English) for authors of Polish origin. Authors from abroad should submit their manuscripts in English.
- The length of original articles** should not exceed 7 pages, including abstracts in Polish and English. Excluding references, tables, and figures.
- The length of review articles** should not exceed 10 pages, including abstracts in Polish and English. This does not include the references, tables, and figures.
- The length of case reports** should not exceed 7 pages, including abstracts in Polish and English. This does not include references, tables, and figures.
- Manuscripts should be written in Microsoft Word, using Times New Roman font size 12, with 1.5 line spacing.
- Suggestions for emphasis should be highlighted in the text using bold type.
- The location of tables and figures should be indicated in the text in bold.
- The following information is required to create **the title page** in the system:

- the full title of the thesis** in Polish and English;
- the abbreviated title of the work** in Polish and English;
- the full first and last name(s) of the author(s)** of the work and their ORCID number;
- the full name of the institution(s)** in Polish and English from which the work originates (in the officially established version); for multi-institutional works, please assign the authors to the institutions they represent;
- designate **the corresponding author** and provide **the institutional mailing address**;
- the first and last name or company name of the entity that **translated the text** into English;
- a description of any potential **conflicts of interest**; if the authors have no conflicts of interest to report, they should add the sentence: “The authors declare no conflicts of interest.”;
- information on **funding sources** (grant, sponsor);
- additional information**: acknowledgments; if applicable, the name of the conference at which the paper was presented should be included here, as well as the patient’s consent to publication, if required.

DO NOT ATTACH THE TITLE PAGE EITHER IN A SEPARATE FILE OR AS PART OF THE MANUSCRIPT IN THE SYSTEM; the above information is required only for submitting the manuscript through the system.

Abstract and keywords

The article must be accompanied by **an abstract**, identical in both Polish and English. The abstracts of original, review, and case report articles should be **200 words** long and consist of **four distinct sections**, labeled as follows: Objective, Materials and Methods, Results, and Conclusions. All **abbreviations** used in the abstract should be explained. The abstract should be followed by no more than **5 keywords** in Polish and English, consistent with the current Medical Subject Headings (MeSH) list.

Structure of the paper

The structure of the paper should include the following distinct sections: Introduction, Objective, Materials and Methods (the Materials and Methods section must explain in detail all research methods used that are reflected in the results, sample selection, and research tools used; the names of statistical methods and software used to analyze the results, as well as ethical considerations, must be provided), Research Results, Discussion, Conclusions, References, Tables, Figures.

Tables

Table titles and their contents should be in Polish and English (in separate tables). All abbreviations used in the tables should be explained below the table. Tables should be labeled above the table and numbered with Arabic numerals (Table 1) and formatted in black and white, in Microsoft Word, in portrait orientation.

Figures

Figures should be labeled below the figure and numbered with Arabic numerals (Fig. 1) and formatted in black and white. All abbreviations used in the figure should be explained below the figure. Figures should be submitted in an editable format.

Abbreviations and symbols

Only standard abbreviations and symbols should be used. A full explanation of a term or symbol should precede its first use in the text and also appear in the legend for each figure and table in which it is used.

References

The reference list should be arranged in the order in which works are cited in the text, tables, and figures (for items cited only in tables and figures, the order should follow the first reference to the table or figure in the text). The number of cited works should not exceed 20 for original articles, 40 for review articles, and 10 for case reports. The reference list should include only published works.

For bibliographic descriptions of journal articles, the following should be provided: the author's last name followed by the first initial (if there are more than 4 authors, only the first three are listed, followed by "et al." the title of the work, the journal title abbreviation (in accordance with the current list of journals indexed in Index Medicus, available at <https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/nlmcatalog?cmd=search>, the year of publication, the volume (issue) number, and the page numbers where the article begins and ends, e.g.:

Descriptions of books should include: surname(s) of the author(s) with the initials of the name, title, possibly the next edition number, name of the publisher, place and year of publication; in collective papers, the name(s) of the responsible editor(s) is given in the book's subtitle and the abbreviation „(ed.)”, and when describing book chapters, the following should be given: Author(s) of the chapter, title of the chapter, then after the designation „[in:]” the title of the whole, the Author(s) (Editor(s) of the whole), the name of the publishing part, the name of the publisher, the place and year of publication and the –page numbers on which the paper begins and ends, e.g.:

Descriptions of monographs (books) should include: the author(s)' last name(s) along with the first initial, title, edition number (if applicable), publisher's name, place, and year of publication; for collective works, the name(s) of the responsible editor(s) should be given in the book's subtitle and abbreviated as "(ed.)", and for descriptions of book chapters, the following should be provided: the author(s) of the chapter, the chapter title, followed by the designation "[in:]" and the title of the entire work, the author(s)(Editor(s)) of the work as a whole, the designation of the publication series, the publisher's name, place and year of publication, and the page numbers where the work begins and ends, e.g.:

- Hryniewicz-Czarnecka M. Mózgowe porażenie dziecięce studium przypadku. Warszawa: Wydawnictwo CzytaMisie; 2021, s. 8-26.
- Kolcaba K. Zmniejszony komfort. Podręcznik diagnoz pielęgniar-skich. Przewodnik planowania opieki opartej na dowodach nauko-wych. [w:] Ackley B, Ladwig G, (red.); Zarzycka D, Ślusarska B. (red. polska). Warszawa: Wyd. GC Media House; 2011, s. 254-256.

It is necessary to **use punctuation** strictly in accordance with the above examples of bibliographic descriptions.

References to online publications are permitted only when adequate data are not available in the printed literature. When using electronic sources, the full website address along with the date of access is required.

Changing the order of authors is acceptable only in exceptional and justified cases. To change the order of authors before the article is published (and/or to add an author), please complete and submit the author change form to the editorial office.

After the manuscript has been accepted for publication and before it is printed, the author must pay a fee of 500.00 PLN or 110 EUR (including VAT) to the following account:
